**DECLARATION OF PETER F. DEL
GRECO IN SUPPORT OF ORDER TO
SHOW CAUSE RE CIVIL CONTEMPT
AGAINST CHRISTIANO HASHIMOTO**

1 I, Peter F. Del Greco, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, declare as follows:

2 1. I am an attorney admitted to practice law by the State Bar of
3 California and by this Court. I am a Staff Attorney with Plaintiff Securities and
4 Exchange Commission (“Commission”) in the Office of Enforcement. I am the
5 attorney chiefly responsible for the conduct of the Commission’s inquiry *In the*
6 *Matter of Financial Solutions* (Matter Number LA-2886) and the civil injunctive
7 action resulting therefrom. I make this declaration in support of the Commission’s
8 Reply In Support Of Order To Show Cause Re Civil Contempt Against Christiano
9 Hashimoto. I have personal knowledge of each of the matters set forth below, and,
10 if called as a witness, I could and would competently testify to the facts stated
11 herein.

12 2. On February 10, 2005, I received a telephone call from David
13 Freniere, Assistant General Counsel for Linsco Private Ledger Corporation
14 (“Linsco”), and Stephanie Secor, Vice-President of Compliance for Linsco,
15 informing me that Christiano Hashimoto had opened a brokerage account at Linsco
16 only two days earlier and deposited into it two million shares of restricted stock
17 issued by Mobile Wireless Security, Inc. (“Mobile Wireless”). Freniere and Secor
18 further informed me that the stock was registered in the name of Financial
19 Solutions. They told me that, in the course of performing its due diligence on the
20 new account, Linsco had determined that Hashimoto and Financial Solutions were
21 the subjects of a civil injunctive action brought by the Commission, and that this
22 determination precipitated their phone call.

23 3. On February 18, 2005, Freniere faxed to me the New Account
24 Application and Agreement (“Application”) and the Certificate of Sole
25 Proprietorship (“Certificate”) completed by Hashimoto on February 8 in
26 connection with the opening of his account at Linsco. A true and correct copy of
27 the Application and Certificate are attached hereto as Exhibit 1. Hashimoto
28 checked boxes in Section III of the Application indicating that both his net worth

1 (excluding his home) and his liquid net worth exceeded \$1 million. Hashimoto
2 signed Section V of the Application, which states in relevant part: “I further
3 certify that all of the information provided on this form is true, correct and
4 complete and that I have received a copy of this form.”

5 4. Also on February 18, 2005, Freniere e-mailed to me the Securities or
6 Check Receipt (“Receipt”) completed by Hashimoto on February 8, which
7 memorializes his deposit of 2 million shares of Mobile Wireless stock into the
8 Linsco account. A true and correct copy of the Receipt is attached hereto as
9 Exhibit 2.

10 I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of
11 America that the foregoing is true and correct. Executed this ___ day of February
