FURTHER ORDER RE ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE RE CONTEMPT AS TO DEFENDANTS PATRICK J. SORIA, WEST H&A LLC, WESTWOOD LEGAL, and HBSC US IN ITS CAPACITY AS LEGAL TITLE HOLDER INCORPORATED AND ORDER DETAINING DEFENDANT SORIA UNTIL HE PURGES HIMSELF OF CONTEMPT

13 On May 31, 2018, this Court issued its Order Finding Defendants Patrick J.
14 Soria, West H&A LLC., Westwood Legal, and HBSC US in its Legal Capacity as
15 Legal Title Holder Incorporated in Contempt (May 31 Order). By its May 31 Order,
16 the Court found Soria and the listed entities to be in civil contempt and ordered
17 Soria and the listed entities (Contemnors) to comply with the requirements listed in
18 the May 31 Order to purge the contempt. The Court continued the hearing to June
19 6, 2018 to allow Mr. Soria an opportunity to purge himself of contempt and avoid
20 incarceration. At the hearing, the Court heard from counsel and Mr. Soria, who
21 appeared pro se. No appearance was made on behalf of the listed entities.

22 The Court finds Contemnors, and specifically Soria, have willfully failed to
23 comply with the requirements of the May 31 Order, though they have the ability to
24 do so, and they remain in civil contempt. The Court finds that incarceration of Mr.
25 Soria is the least coercive sanction that is appropriate under the circumstances.

26 THEREFORE, the Court orders that Patrick Soria be detained for civil
27 contempt indefinitely and until such time as the Court determines that he has
28 complied with the Court's orders. The Court will hold a hearing at such time that it
is advised by Plaintiff or the Receiver that Mr. Soria has purged himself of
contempt. The Court will set a status conference from time to time to determine

1 whether continued incarceration is appropriate. The first status conference is set for
2 August 6 at 11:00 a.m.
