NOTICE TO CONSUMERS

On July 17, 2012, the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau filed an action against The Gordon Law Firm, P.C., Resource Legal Group, and affiliates and subsidiaries. The U.S. District Court issued a Temporary Restraining Order and appointed Robb Evans & Associates LLC as Temporary Receiver to take over temporary possession and control of the Receivership Defendants.

The companies have been operating on a reduced scale. Loan modification activities have stopped pending further Court determination. The Temporary Receiver has requested lenders to postpone upcoming foreclosure sales to allow homeowners to discuss the loan modification process directly with their lenders. The Temporary Receiver has not deposited any post-dated checks forwarded by consumers and stopped authorized reoccurring electronic bank withdrawals.

The Temporary Receiver strongly urges you to call or make contact with your home lender, tell them that you want to take over the loan modification discussion and process, and request your lender to use the documents already supplied. Ask your lender if a foreclosure sale date has been scheduled. You should also tell the lender that your agent has been sued by the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau and its loan modification activities have stopped pending further Court determination. The Temporary Receiver recommends you take a positive and proactive approach and agree to supply any missing information to the lender.

You can call around-the-clock to (888) 995-HOPE and also get information online about HUD Approved Housing Counseling Agencies and available free assistance regarding mortgage relief negotiation. You may also call the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau Response Unit toll free at (855) 411-2372 and view information on the Bureau's website <http://www.consumerfinance.gov>.

The U.S. District Court will decide about future operations of the companies and how refund requests will be handled. As additional information becomes available, it will be posted on the Temporary Receiver's website.
