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 28 ORDER ON 1ST STIP. TO EXTEND TRO AND CONTINUE HEARING
 ON OSC RE: PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION - 1-

1 Plaintiff Federal Trade Commission and Defendants Cream Group, Inc., also
2 d/b/a Terra Nova, TNT, Inc., and CRM, Inc.; Sami Charchian, also d/b/a Oro
3 Marketing, Inc., Modo, Modo Industry, Oro Max, Casa de Oro, Casa de Moda, Oro
4 Mundo, and Nation/Modo; John Charchian, also d/b/a Oro Marketing, Inc., Modo,
5 Modo Industry, Oro Max, Casa de Oro, Casa de Moda, Oro Mundo, and
6 Nation/Modo; and Norma Rae Ramos (collectively “Defendants”), having applied
7 for an order that: 1) continues the hearing on the Order to Show Cause Why a
8 Preliminary Injunction Should Not Issue (“Preliminary Injunction hearing”) until
9 January 7, 2014, or at such later date as is convenient to the Court; 2) extends the
10 Temporary Restraining Order (“TRO”) through the date of the continued
11 Preliminary Injunction hearing; 3) requires Defendants to make the financial
12 disclosures mandated by Section VI of the TRO by December 18, 2013; and 4) sets
13 new deadlines for any documents filed or served pursuant to Section XX of the
14 TRO,

15 **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that:

16 1) The Preliminary Injunction hearing is continued until January 10, 2014,
17 at 9:00 a.m. (Pacific Time);

18 2) The TRO is extended through the date of the Preliminary Injunction
19 hearing, and during this extension shall remain in full force and effect;

20 3) On or before December 18, 2013, Defendants shall prepare and deliver to
21 counsel for Plaintiff the financial statements and other information identified in
22 Section VI of the TRO;

23 4) Defendants shall file any answering affidavits, pleadings, or
24 legal memoranda with the Court and serve the same on counsel for Plaintiff by no
25 later than 4:00 p.m. (Pacific Time) seven (7) business days prior to the date of the
26 continued hearing on the Preliminary Injunction; and

27 5) Plaintiff FTC shall file and serve any responsive or supplemental



1 pleadings, materials, affidavits, or memoranda with the Court and serve the same
2 on counsel for Defendants by no later than 4:00 p.m. (Pacific Time) one (1)
3 business day prior to the date of the continued hearing on the Preliminary
4 Injunction; and

5 6) The procedure for seeking live testimony at any Preliminary Injunction
6 hearing remains as set forth in Section XXII of the TRO.
