**ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR  
ORDER MODIFYING  
DISTRIBUTION PROCEDURES**

20 Robb Evans, Receiver of Defendants Equinox International Corporation,  
21 Advanced Marketing Seminars, Inc. and BG Management, Inc. and Related Entities  
22 (“Receiver”) filed his Motion for Order Modifying Distribution Procedures  
23 (“Motion”) on January 3, 2008. The Court, having read and considered the Motion  
24 and all papers filed in support thereof, no opposition to the Motion having been  
25 filed despite due and proper notice having been given, and good cause being shown  
26 therefor,

1 IT IS ORDERED that the Motion shall be and hereby is granted in its  
2 entirety; and it is further

3 ORDERED that without limiting the generality of the preceding sentence,  
4 distribution procedures shall be modified as follows:


5 1. The Receiver may remove 13,193 distributor claimants with invalid  
6 addresses from the initial distribution;

7 2. The Receiver may proceed to distribute approximately \$16,580,000 in  
8 the initial distribution to the remaining claimants with valid mailing addresses  
9 whose claims aggregate approximately \$276,800,000, so that the initial distribution  
10 is approximately 5.99% to these claimants;

11 3. The Receiver may distribute the lesser of 5.99% on allowed claims to  
12 any of the 13,193 distributor claimants with invalid addresses who come forward  
13 later and advise the Receiver of a valid address for mailing, to be paid from a pool  
14 of funds unclaimed from the initial distribution, to the extent available, or if such  
15 amount is not available, a lesser pro rata sum among such claimants, determined at  
16 the time that the initial distribution checks become stale dated, to be fixed at three  
17 months after distribution; and

18 4. The minimum distribution shall be fixed at \$5.00 so that those  
19 claimants with projected distributions below that figure receive a flat \$5.00  
20 distribution.
