To Bankruptcy Clients of UCLG:

On April 23, 2004 the Federal Trade Commission filed a lawsuit against National Consumer Council, London Financial Group, National Consumer Debt Council, LLC, Solidium, LLC, J. P. Landis, LLC, Financial Rescue Services, Inc., et al. The Federal Trade Commission has alleged that the companies violated the FTC act by Misrepresentations and Omissions and violated other Regulations and Acts.

On May 3, 2004 the United States District Court entered an Order appointing Robb Evans & Associates LLC as Temporary Receiver and thereafter, on May 21, 2004, National Consumer Council, London Financial Group, National Consumer Debt Council, LLC, Solidium, LLC, J. P. Landis, LLC, Financial Rescue Services, Inc. and United Consumers Law Group, P.C., et al., each entered into a Stipulation and Preliminary Injunction for the appointment of Robb Evans & Associates LLC as Receiver and continuation of an asset freeze and other relief.

The Receiver has control of all UCLG funds and computer and other records. Pursuant to the Preliminary Injunctions entered as to all parties by the United States District Court on May 21, 2004, the businesses are now closed. You can obtain a copy of the various Court Orders on the Receiver's website at www.ncc-receiver.com.

I am an attorney and a member of Robb Evans & Associates LLC, the Receiver. The Receiver is advised that you are now, or have in the past been, a bankruptcy client of UCLG. Please be advised that all documents pertaining to an intended future bankruptcy case are being returned to you. In the event you are still interested in filing for bankruptcy, you will need to choose another attorney to do so, or complete the filing yourself.

If you have already had contact or established a relationship with an attorney referred by UCLG, you may receive a letter or call from that attorney. Any such attorney is not referred by the Receiver or the Federal Trade Commission. However, you may establish

or maintain a relationship with any attorney that you choose. The Receiver has directed attorneys that received prepaid bankruptcy fees to continue services through completion of the bankruptcy process, although some attorneys may not follow that direction.

The Receiver's goal is to return, as soon as possible, your remaining funds (the amount left after fees taken by UCLG) that were held in a trust account for filing and other expenses related to a bankruptcy. The Receiver is completing the reconciliation of accounts and verification of other possible claims, and will apply for Court approval to complete the distribution of your remaining trust funds to you. This verification and Court approval process could take from six to eight weeks. No further action is required from you.
