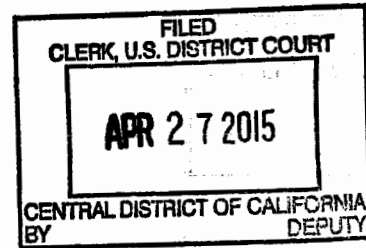

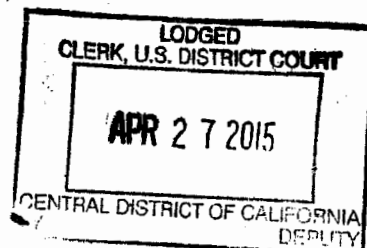

5 Plaintiff Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") has filed a complaint seeking a  
6 permanent injunction and other equitable relief, pursuant to Sections 13(b) and 19  
7 of the Federal Trade Commission Act ("FTC Act"), 15 U.S.C. §§ 53(b) and 57(b),  
8 and Section 7(a) of the Controlling the Assault of Non-Solicited Pornography and  
9 Marketing Act of 2003 (the "CAN-SPAM Act"), 15 U.S.C. § 7706(a). The FTC  
10 also has moved pursuant to Rule 65(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure,  
11 Fed. R. Civ. P. 65, for an *Ex Parte* Temporary Restraining Order with an Asset  
12 Freeze, Appointment of a Receiver, and Other Equitable Relief, and Order to Show  
13 Cause Why a Preliminary Injunction Should Not Issue ("TRO" or "Order").  
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17 **FINDINGS OF FACT**  
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19 This Court, having considered the complaint, the TRO application, and all  
20 attached declarations, exhibits, and memorandum of law filed in support, finds  
21 that:  
22

23 1. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this case, there is  
24 good cause to believe it will have jurisdiction over all the parties hereto, and venue  
25 in this district is proper;  
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1           2.     There is good cause to believe that Defendants Sale Slash, LLC, a  
2 California limited liability company, Purists Choice LLC, a California limited  
3 liability company, Artur Babayan, and Vahe Haroutounian have engaged and are  
4 likely to continue to engage in acts or practices that violate Sections 5(a) and 12 of  
5 the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 45(a) & 52, and Section 5(a) of the CAN-SPAM Act,  
6 15 U.S.C. § 7704(a), and that the FTC is therefore likely to prevail on the merits of  
7 this action;  
8

9  
10           3.     There is good cause to believe that consumers will suffer immediate  
11 and continuing harm from Defendants' ongoing violations of Section 5(a) and 12  
12 of the FTC Act and Section 5(a) of the CAN-SPAM Act unless Defendants are  
13 restrained and enjoined by Order of this Court;  
14  
15

16           4.     There is good cause to believe that immediate and irreparable damage  
17 to the Court's ability to grant effective final relief for consumers in the form of  
18 monetary restitution and/or disgorgement of ill-gotten gains will occur from the  
19 transfer, dissipation, or concealment by Defendants of their assets or business  
20 records unless Defendants are immediately restrained and enjoined by order of this  
21 Court; and that in accordance with Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b) and Local Rule 7-19.2, the  
22 interest of justice requires that the FTC's application be heard *ex parte* without  
23 prior notice to Defendants. Therefore, there is good cause for relieving the FTC of  
24 the duty to provide Defendants with prior notice of the FTC's application;  
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1 5. Good cause exists for appointing a receiver over the Corporate  
2 Defendants, permitting the FTC immediate access to Defendants' business  
3 premises, and permitting the FTC to take expedited discovery;  
4

5 6. Weighing the equities and considering the FTC's likelihood of  
6 ultimate success, a temporary restraining order with an asset freeze, appointment of  
7 a receiver, immediate access to business premises, expedited discovery as to the  
8 existence and location of assets and documents, and other equitable relief is in the  
9 public interest;  
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12 7. No security is required of any agency of the United States for issuance  
13 of a TRO, Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(c); and  
14

15 8. The interest of justice requires that the FTC's TRO Application be  
16 heard without notice to Defendants, and as a result, pursuant to Local Rule 7-19.2,  
17 the Court waives the notice requirement of Local Rule 7-19.1.  
18

### 19 DEFINITIONS

20 For the purposes of this TRO, the following definitions shall apply:  
21

22 1. "Asset" or "Assets" means any legal or equitable interest in, right to,  
23 or claim to, any real or personal property, including, but not limited to, "goods,"  
24 "instruments," "equipment," "fixtures," "general intangibles," "inventory,"  
25 "checks," or "notes" (as these terms are defined in the Uniform Commercial  
26 Code), lines of credit, chattels, leaseholds, contracts, mail or other deliveries,  
27  
28

1 shares of stock, lists of consumer names, accounts, credits, premises, receivables,  
2 funds, and all cash, wherever located.

3           2.     **“Assisting others”** includes, but is not limited to: (a) performing  
4 customer service functions, including, but not limited to, receiving or responding  
5 to consumer complaints; (b) formulating or providing, or arranging for the  
6 formulation or provision of, any sales script or other marketing material;  
7 (c) providing names of, or assisting in the generation of, potential customers;  
8 (d) performing or providing marketing or billing services of any kind; (e) acting as  
9 an officer or director of a business entity; (f) hosting websites; or (g) processing  
10 payments.  
11

12           3.     **“Clear and conspicuous”** and **“clearly and conspicuously”** means  
13 that a required disclosure is difficult to miss (i.e., easily noticeable) and easily  
14 understandable by ordinary consumers, including in all of the following ways:  
15

16           a.     In any communication that is solely visual or solely audible, the  
17 disclosure must be made through the same means through which the  
18 communication is presented. In any communication made through both visual and  
19 audible means, such as a television advertisement, the disclosure must be presented  
20 simultaneously in both the visual and audible portions of the communication, even  
21 if the representation requiring the disclosure is made in only one means.  
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1           b.     A visual disclosure, by its size, contrast, location, the length of  
2 time it appears, and other characteristics, must stand out from any accompanying  
3 text or other visual elements so that it is easily noticed, read, and understood.

4           c.     An audible disclosure, including by telephone or streaming  
5 video, must be delivered in a volume, speed, and cadence sufficient for ordinary  
6 consumers to easily hear and understand it.

7           d.     In any communication using an interactive electronic medium,  
8 such as the Internet or software, the disclosure must be unavoidable.

9           e.     The disclosure must use diction and syntax understandable to  
10 ordinary consumers and must appear in each language in which the representation  
11 that requires the disclosure appears.

12           f.     The disclosure must comply with these requirements in each  
13 medium through which it is received, including all electronic devices and face-to-  
14 face communications.

15           g.     The disclosure must not be contradicted or mitigated by, or  
16 inconsistent with, anything else in the communication.

17           4.     **“Commercial electronic mail message”** (or **“commercial email”**)  
18 means any electronic mail message the primary purpose of which is the  
19 commercial advertisement or promotion of a commercial product or service  
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1 (including the content on an Internet website operated for commercial purposes).  
2 15 U.S.C. § 7702(2).

3  
4 5. **“Competent and reliable scientific evidence”** means tests, analyses,  
5 research, or studies that have been conducted and evaluated in an objective manner  
6 by qualified persons and are generally accepted in the profession to yield accurate  
7 and reliable results.

8  
9 6. **“Corporate Defendants”** or **“Receivership Defendants”** means Sale  
10 Slash, LLC, a California limited liability company, and Purists Choice LLC, a  
11 California limited liability company, and their successors and assigns, as well as  
12 any subsidiaries, and any fictitious business entities or business names created or  
13 used by these entities.

14  
15 7. **“Covered Product”** means any dietary supplement, food, or drug,  
16 including, but not limited to, Premium Green Coffee, Premium Raspberry Ketone,  
17 Pure Caralluma Fimbriata Extract, Pure Forskolin Extract, Pure Garcinia  
18 Cambogia, Pure Garcinia Cambogia HCA, Pure Saffron, and Pure White Kidney  
19 Bean Extract.

20  
21 8. **“Defendants”** means all of the Individual Defendants and the  
22 Corporate Defendants, individually, collectively, or in any combination.

23  
24 9. **“Document”** or **“Documents”** means any materials listed in Federal  
25 Rule of Civil Procedure 34(a), and includes writings, drawings, graphs, charts,  
26  
27  
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1 photographs, audio and video recordings, computer records, and other data  
2 compilations from which information can be obtained and translated, if necessary,  
3 through detection devices into reasonably usable form. A draft or non-identical  
4 copy is a separate document within the meaning of the term.

6 10. **“Financial Institution”** means any bank, savings and loan institution,  
7 credit union, or any financial depository of any kind, including, but not limited to,  
8 any brokerage house, trustee, broker-dealer, escrow agent, title company,  
9 commodity trading company, or precious metal dealer.

12 11. **“Header Information”** means the source, destination, and routing  
13 information attached to an electronic mail message, including the originating  
14 domain name and originating electronic mail address, and any other information  
15 that appears in the line identifying, or purporting to identify, a person initiating the  
16 message. 15 U.S.C. § 7702(8).

19 12. **“Individual Defendants”** means Artur Babayan and Vahe  
20 Haroutounian, or by whatever other name each may be known.

22 13. **“Initiate,”** when used with respect to a commercial electronic mail  
23 message, means to originate or transmit such message or to procure the origination  
24 or transmission of such message. 15 U.S.C. § 7702(9).

26 14. **“Person”** means a natural person, an organization or other legal  
27 entity, including a corporation, partnership, sole proprietorship, limited liability  
28



1 company, association, cooperative, or any other group or combination acting as an  
2 entity.

3 15. **“Plaintiff,” “Commission,”** or **“FTC”** means the Federal Trade  
4 Commission.  
5

6 16. **“Procure,”** when used with respect to the initiation of a commercial  
7 electronic mail message, means intentionally to pay or provide other consideration  
8 to, or induce, another person to initiate such a message on one’s behalf. 15 U.S.C.  
9 § 7702(12).  
10

11 17. **“Sender”** means a person who initiates a commercial electronic mail  
12 message and whose product, service, or Internet website is advertised or promoted  
13 by the message. 15 U.S.C. § 7702(16).  
14  
15

16 **I.**

17 **PROHIBITED WEIGHT-LOSS CLAIMS**

18 **IT IS ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents, servants,  
19 employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation  
20 with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order, whether acting directly  
21 or indirectly, in connection with the manufacturing, labeling, advertising,  
22 promotion, offering for sale, sale, or distribution of any Covered Product, are  
23 hereby temporarily restrained and enjoined from making, or assisting others in  
24 making, directly or by implication, including through the use of a product name,  
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1 endorsement, depiction, or illustration, any representation, that:

2 A. Such Covered Product causes, or assists in causing, weight loss, or  
3 any specific amount of weight loss;  
4

5 B. Such Covered Product causes, or assists in causing, rapid weight loss;  
6 or

7  
8 C. Consumers who use the Covered Product can generally expect to  
9 achieve the weight loss results represented by an endorser of such Covered  
10 Product;

11  
12 unless the representation is non-misleading and, at the time of making such  
13 representation, Defendants possess and rely upon competent and reliable scientific  
14 evidence, as that term is defined above, that is sufficient in quality and quantity  
15 based on standards generally accepted in the scientific fields, when considered in  
16 light of the entire body of relevant and reliable scientific evidence, to substantiate  
17 the representation is true.  
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20 **II.**

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22 **PROHIBITED MISREPRESENTATIONS**

23 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents,  
24 servants, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or  
25 participation with any of them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal  
26 service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any corporation,  
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1 subsidiary, division, or other device, in connection with the advertising, marketing,  
2 promotion, offering for sale, or sale of any Covered Product, are hereby  
3 temporarily restrained and enjoined from misrepresenting, or assisting others in  
4 misrepresenting, directly or indirectly, expressly or by implication, any material  
5 fact, including, but not limited to, that Defendants' products are or have been used,  
6 endorsed, or approved by specifically identified celebrities such as Oprah Winfrey  
7 and The Doctors television show.  
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11 **III.**

12 **PROHIBITIONS AGAINST**  
13 **COMMERCIAL EMAIL MISREPRESENTATIONS**

14 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents,  
15 servants, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or  
16 participation with any of them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal  
17 service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any corporation,  
18 subsidiary, division, or other device, in connection with the advertising, marketing,  
19 promotion, offering for sale, or sale of any product, service, or program, are hereby  
20 temporarily restrained and enjoined from initiating the transmission of a  
21 commercial email that:  
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24 A. Contains, or is accompanied by, materially false or materially  
25 misleading header information, including but not limited to:  
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1           A.     Does not include a clear and conspicuous notice of the recipient's  
2 opportunity to decline to receive further commercial electronic mail messages from  
3 the sender at the recipient's electronic mail address and describes the means by  
4 which the recipient can decline to receive future commercial email messages from  
5 the sender;  
6

7           B.     Does not include a functioning return electronic mail address or other  
8 Internet-based mechanism, clearly and conspicuously displayed, that a recipient  
9 can use to submit a reply electronic mail message or other form of Internet-based  
10 communication requesting not to receive future commercial electronic mail  
11 messages from the sender at the electronic mail address where the message was  
12 received, and that remains capable of receiving such messages or communications  
13 for no less than 30 days after the transmission of the original message;  
14  
15

16           C.     Does not include the sender's valid physical postal address; or  
17

18           D.     Is sent to a recipient's email address, more than 10 days after the  
19 sender receives a request from that email recipient not to receive future  
20 commercial electronic mail messages from the sender at the recipient's electronic  
21 mail address.

**ASSET FREEZE**

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any trust, corporation, subsidiary, division, or other device, except as provided herein, as stipulated by the parties, or as directed by further order of the Court, are hereby temporarily restrained and enjoined from:

A. Transferring, liquidating, converting, encumbering, pledging, loaning, selling, concealing, dissipating, disbursing, assigning, spending, withdrawing, granting a lien or security interest or other interest in, or otherwise disposing of any funds, real or personal property, accounts, contracts, shares of stock, lists of consumer names, or other assets, or any interest therein, wherever located, including outside the territorial United States, that are:

1. Owned, controlled, or held by, in whole or in part, for the benefit of, or subject to access by, or belonging to, any Defendant;
2. In the actual or constructive possession of any Defendant; or
3. In the actual or constructive possession of, or owned, controlled, or held by, or subject to access by, or belonging to, any other

1 corporation, partnership, trust, or any other entity directly or indirectly owned,  
2 managed, or controlled by, or under common control with, any Defendant,  
3 including, but not limited to, any assets held by or for any Defendant in any  
4 account at any bank or savings and loan institution, or with any credit card  
5 processing agent, automated clearing house processor, network transaction  
6 processor, bank debit processing agent, customer service agent, commercial mail  
7 receiving agency, or mail holding or forwarding company, or any credit union,  
8 retirement fund custodian, money market or mutual fund, storage company,  
9 trustee, or with any broker-dealer, escrow agent, title company, commodity trading  
10 company, precious metal dealer, or other financial institution or depository of any  
11 kind, either within or outside the territorial United States;

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15  
16 B. Opening or causing to be opened any safe deposit boxes, commercial  
17 mail boxes, or storage facilities titled in the name of any Defendant, or subject to  
18 access by any Defendant or under any Defendant's control, without providing the  
19 Commission prior notice and an opportunity to inspect the contents in order to  
20 determine that they contain no assets covered by this Section;  
21

22  
23 C. Cashing any checks or depositing or processing any payments from  
24 customers or clients of Defendants;  
25

26 D. Incurring charges or cash advances on any credit card issued in the  
27 name, singly or jointly, of any Defendant; or  
28

1 E. Incurring liens or encumbrances on real property, personal property,  
2 or other assets in the name, singly or jointly, of any Defendant or of any  
3 corporation, partnership, or other entity directly or indirectly owned, managed, or  
4 controlled by any Defendant.  
5

6 Notwithstanding the asset freeze provisions of Section V.A-E above, and  
7 subject to prior written agreement with the Commission, Individual Defendants  
8 may, upon compliance with Section IX (Financial Statements) *infra*, pay from their  
9 individual personal funds reasonable, usual, ordinary, and necessary living  
10 expenses.  
11

12 The funds, property, and assets affected by this Section shall include both  
13 existing assets and assets acquired after the effective date of this Order.  
14

### 16 DUTIES OF THIRD PARTIES HOLDING DEFENDANTS' ASSETS

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18  
19 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that any financial institution, business entity,  
20 or person maintaining or having custody or control of any account or other asset of  
21 any Defendant, or any corporation, partnership, or other entity directly or indirectly  
22 owned, managed, or controlled by, or under common control with any Defendant,  
23 which is served with a copy of this Order, or otherwise has actual or constructive  
24 knowledge of this Order, shall:  
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1           A.    Hold and retain within its control and prohibit the withdrawal,  
2 removal, assignment, transfer, pledge, hypothecation, encumbrance, disbursement,  
3 dissipation, conversion, sale, liquidation, or other disposal of any of the assets,  
4 funds, documents, or other property held by, or under its control:  
5

6                 1.    On behalf of, or for the benefit of, any Defendant or any other  
7 Person subject to Section V above;  
8

9                 2.    In any account maintained in the name of, or for the benefit of,  
10 or subject to withdrawal by, any Defendant or other Person subject to Section V  
11 above; and  
12

13                3.    That are subject to access or use by, or under the signatory  
14 power of, any Defendant or other Person subject to Section V above;  
15

16           B.    Deny Defendants access to any safe deposit boxes or storage facilities  
17 that are either:  
18

19                 1.    Titled in the name, individually or jointly, of any Defendant, or  
20 other Person subject to Section V above; or  
21

22                 2.    Subject to access by any Defendant or other Person subject to  
23 Section V above;  
24

25           C.    Within five (5) days of the date of service of this Order, provide  
26 Plaintiff a sworn statement setting forth:  
27  
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1           1.     The identification number of each account or asset titled in the  
2 name, individually or jointly, of any Defendant, or held on behalf of, or for the  
3 benefit of, any Defendant or other Person subject to Section V above, including all  
4 trust accounts managed on behalf of any Defendant or subject to any Defendant's  
5 control;  
6

7           2.     The balance of each such account, or a description of the nature  
8 and value of such asset;  
9

10          3.     The identification and location of any safe deposit box,  
11 commercial mail box, or storage facility that is either titled in the name,  
12 individually or jointly, of any Defendant, or is otherwise subject to access or  
13 control by any Defendant or other Person subject to Section V above, whether in  
14 whole or in part; and  
15

16          4.     If the account, safe deposit box, storage facility, or other asset  
17 has been closed or removed, the date closed or removed and the balance on said  
18 date;  
19

20          D.     Within five (5) days of a request from any Plaintiff, provide Plaintiff  
21 copies of all records or other documentation pertaining to each such account or  
22 asset, including, but not limited to, originals or copies of account applications,  
23 account statements, corporate resolutions, signature cards, checks, drafts, deposit  
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1 tickets, transfers to and from the accounts, all other debit and credit instruments or  
2 slips, currency transaction reports, 1099 forms, and safe deposit box logs; and

3 E. This Section VI shall apply to existing accounts and assets, assets  
4 deposited or accounts opened after the effective date of this Order, and any  
5 accounts or assets maintained, held or controlled three years prior to the effective  
6 date of this Order. This Section VI shall not prohibit transfers in accordance with  
7 any other provision of this Order, any further order of the Court, or by written  
8 agreement of the parties.  
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12 **VII.**

13 **MAINTAIN RECORDS AND REPORT NEW BUSINESS ACTIVITY**

14 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents,  
15 servants, employees, attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or  
16 participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order by personal  
17 service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any trust, corporation,  
18 subsidiary, division, or other device, are hereby temporarily restrained and  
19 enjoined from:  
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23 A. Failing to create and maintain books, records, accounts, bank  
24 statements, current accountants' reports, general ledgers, general journals, cash  
25 receipt ledgers, cash disbursement ledgers and source documents, documents  
26 indicating title to real or personal property, and any other data which, in reasonable  
27  
28

1 detail, accurately, fairly and completely reflect the incomes, disbursements,  
2 transactions, dispositions, and uses of the Defendants' assets;

3 B. Destroying, erasing, mutilating, concealing, altering, transferring, or  
4 otherwise disposing of, in any manner, directly or indirectly, any documents,  
5 including electronically-stored materials, that relate in any way to the business  
6 practices or business or personal finances of Defendants; to the business practices  
7 or finances of entities directly or indirectly under the control of Defendants; or to  
8 the business practices or finances of entities directly or indirectly under common  
9 control with any other Defendant; and  
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13 C. Creating, operating, or exercising any control over any new business  
14 entity, whether newly formed or previously inactive, including any partnership,  
15 limited partnership, joint venture, sole proprietorship, or corporation, without first  
16 providing Plaintiff with a written statement disclosing: (1) the name of the business  
17 entity; (2) the address, telephone number, email address, and website address of the  
18 business entity; (3) the names of the business entity's officers, directors, principals,  
19 managers, and employees; and (4) a detailed description of the business entity's  
20 intended activities.

**PROHIBITION ON DISCLOSING CUSTOMER INFORMATION**

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any trust, corporation, subsidiary, division, or other device, are hereby temporarily restrained and enjoined from:

A. Selling, renting, leasing, transferring, or otherwise disclosing the name, address, birth date, telephone number, email address, Social Security number, Social Insurance number, credit card number, bank account number, or other financial or identifying personal information of any person from whom or about whom any Defendant obtained such information in connection with activities alleged in Plaintiff's Complaint; and

B. Benefiting from or using the name, address, birth date, telephone number, email address, Social Security number, Social Insurance number, credit card number, bank account number, or other financial or identifying personal information of any person from whom or about whom any Defendant obtained such information in connection with activities alleged in Plaintiff's Complaint.

1           *Provided, however*, that Defendants may disclose such financial or  
2 identifying personal information to a law enforcement agency or as required by  
3 any law, regulation, or court order.  
4

6                                   **FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

7           **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that each Defendant shall serve upon  
8 counsel for Plaintiff, no later than five (5) business days after service of this Order,  
9 a completed financial statement accurate as of the date of entry of this Order, on  
10 the forms served on Defendants with this Order for Individual Defendants and for  
11 Corporate Defendants, as the case may be, signed under penalty of perjury.  
12  
13

14           The financial statements shall include assets held outside the territory of the  
15 United States, shall be accurate as of the date of the entry of this Order, and shall  
16 be verified under oath. Defendants shall attach to these completed financial  
17 statements copies of all local, state, provincial, and federal income and property tax  
18 returns, with attachments and schedules, as called for by the instructions to the  
19 financial statements.

**TEMPORARY RECEIVER**

**A. APPOINTMENT OF TEMPORARY RECEIVER**

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Robb Evans & Associates LLC IS

appointed Temporary Equity Receiver ("Receiver") for Receivership Defendants and any of their affiliates, subsidiaries, divisions, or sales or customer service operations, wherever located, with the full power of an equity receiver. The Receiver shall be the agent of this Court, and solely the agent of this Court, in acting as Receiver under this Order. The Receiver shall be accountable directly to this Court. The Receiver shall comply with all Local Rules of this Court governing receivers.

**B. RECEIVERSHIP DUTIES**

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the Receiver is directed and authorized to accomplish the following:

1.
