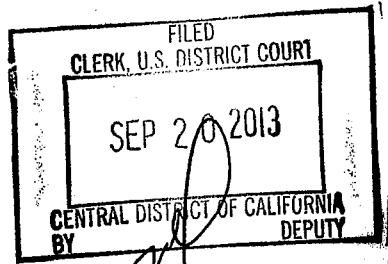

1 Plaintiff Federal Trade Commission and Defendants Applied Marketing
2 Sciences, LLC, Standard Registration Corporation, Worldwide Information
3 Systems, Incorporated, and Liam O. Moran, having stipulated to the following
4 terms, and good cause appearing, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

6 1. The *Ex Parte* Temporary Restraining Order with an Asset
7 Freeze, Appointment of a Receiver, and Other Equitable Relief, and Order to Show
8 Cause Why a Preliminary Injunction Should Not Issue, entered by the Court on
9 September 17, 2013, should be extended in full force and effect until October 7,
10 2013, at 5:00 p.m (Pacific Time), unless within such time the Order, for good
11 cause shown, is extended, or unless, as to any Defendant, the Defendant consents
12 that it should be extended for a longer period of time;
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16 2. Each Defendant has been properly served and that this Court has
17 jurisdiction over the subject matter of this case, this Court has jurisdiction over all
18 the parties hereto, and venue in this district is proper;
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
20 3. Each Defendant shall appear before this Court on the 7th day of
21 October, 2013, at 10:00 a.m. at the United States Courthouse, United States
22 District Court for the Central District of California, Los Angeles, to show cause, if
23 any, why this Court should not enter a preliminary injunction, pending final ruling
24 on the Complaint, against said Defendants enjoining them from further violations
25 of Section 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a); continuing the freeze of their
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1 assets; making the temporary Receiver's appointment permanent; and imposing
2 such additional relief as may be appropriate. The hearing previously scheduled for
3 the 23rd day of September 2013, is cancelled; and
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5 4. Defendants shall file with the Court and serve on Plaintiff's counsel
6 any answering affidavits, pleadings, motions, expert reports or declarations, and/or
7 legal memoranda no later than ^{ten (10)} ~~four (4)~~ business days prior to the hearing on
8 Plaintiff's request for a preliminary injunction; Plaintiff may file responsive or
9 supplemental pleadings, materials, affidavits, or memoranda with the Court and
10 serve the same on counsel for Defendants no later than ^{five (5)} ~~one (1)~~ day prior to the
11 preliminary injunction hearing in this matter, provided that service shall be
12 performed by personal or overnight delivery, by electronic filing, by electronic
13 mail, or by facsimile, and documents shall be delivered so that they shall be
14 received by the other parties no later than 4:00 p.m. (Pacific Time) on the
15 appropriate dates. Live testimony shall be heard only on further order of this Court
16 or on motion filed with the Court and served on counsel for the other parties at
17 least four (4) business days prior to the preliminary injunction hearing in this
18 matter. Such motion shall set forth the name, address, and telephone number of
19 each proposed witness, a detailed summary or affidavit revealing the substance of
20 each proposed witness's expected testimony, and an explanation of why the taking
21 of live testimony would be helpful to this Court. Any papers opposing a timely
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1 motion to present live testimony or to present live testimony in response to another
2 party's timely motion to present live testimony shall be filed with this Court and
3 served on the other parties at least two (2) business days prior to the preliminary
4 injunction hearing in this matter, provided that service shall be performed by
5 personal or overnight delivery, by electronic filing, by electronic mail, or by
6 facsimile, and documents shall be delivered so that they shall be received by the
7 other parties no later than 4:00 p.m. (Pacific Time) on the appropriate dates.
